REQUEST FOR AN ADVISORY OPINION SUBMITTED BY THE COMMISSION OF SMALL ISLAND STATES ON CLIMATE CHANGE AND INTERNATIONAL LAW

REVISED SCHEDULE OF THE PUBLIC HEARINGS

The public hearings of the International Tribunal for the Law of the Sea relating to the Request for an Advisory Opinion submitted by the Commission of Small Island States on Climate Change and International Law will open on Monday, 11 September 2023 at 10 a.m. The President of the Tribunal, Judge Albert Hoffmann, will preside over the sitting.

Further to the Order 2023/4 of 30 June 2023, 35 States Parties and 3 intergovernmental organizations, in addition to the Commission of Small Island States on Climate Change and International Law (COSIS), will participate in the hearing: Argentina, Australia, Bangladesh, Belize, Bolivia, Chile, China, Comoros, Democratic Republic of Congo, Djibouti, European Union, France, Germany, Guatemala, India, Indonesia, Italy, Latvia, Mauritius, Mexico, Micronesia (Federated States of), Mozambique, Nauru, Netherlands, New Zealand, Norway, Philippines, Portugal, Republic of Korea, Saudi Arabia, Sierra Leone, Singapore, Timor-Leste, United Kingdom, Viet Nam, African Union, International Union for Conservation of Nature and Natural Resources, and Pacific Community.
