**CASE CONCERNING AN INQUIRY BY THE
INTERNATIONAL SEABED AUTHORITY
(NAURU OCEAN RESOURCES INC. V. INTERNATIONAL SEABED AUTHORITY)**

REQUEST FOR PROVISIONAL MEASURES

PUBLIC HEARING TO OPEN ON 2 JULY 2026

By Order of 10 June 2026, the President of the Seabed Disputes Chamber, Judge David Joseph Attard, fixed 2 July 2026 as the date for the opening of the oral proceedings in the *Case concerning an inquiry by the International Seabed Authority (Nauru Ocean Resources Inc. v. International Seabed Authority)*. A copy of the Order is available on the [website](#) of the Tribunal.

Nauru Ocean Resources Inc. (“NORI”) instituted proceedings before the Seabed Disputes Chamber of the Tribunal against the International Seabed Authority (“the Authority”) on 5 June 2026. The Applicant contends that it is in dispute with the Authority regarding the manner by which the Authority is conducting an inquiry into NORI as a contractor allegedly requiring “specific attention” for possible non-compliance with its contractual obligations arising out of direct or indirect actions related to activities in the Area.

The Application was accompanied by a request for the prescription of provisional measures under article 290, paragraph 1, of the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea. In the request, the Seabed Disputes Chamber is requested to order the Authority, *inter alia*, to suspend its inquiry, to refrain from taking, authorizing or permitting any steps in connection with its inquiry, and to refrain from taking any step or adopting any position that would have the effect of adversely affecting the Applicant’s application for an extension of the exploration contract. The schedule for the hearing, which will be devoted to the request for provisional measures, will be published on the [website](#) of the Tribunal.

The hearing will take place in the main courtroom of the Tribunal and is open to the public. Members of the diplomatic and consular corps and the general public wishing to attend the hearing are requested to register in advance with the [Press Office](#).
